Adult narrates what the <u>child</u> is doing.

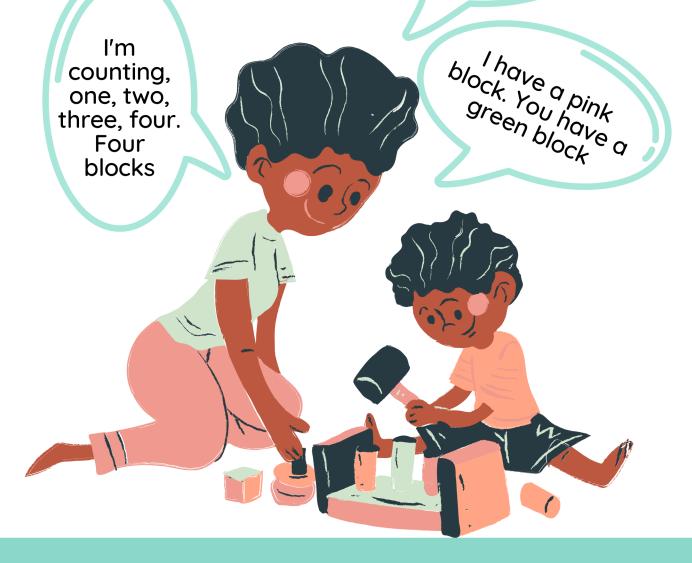

Extension

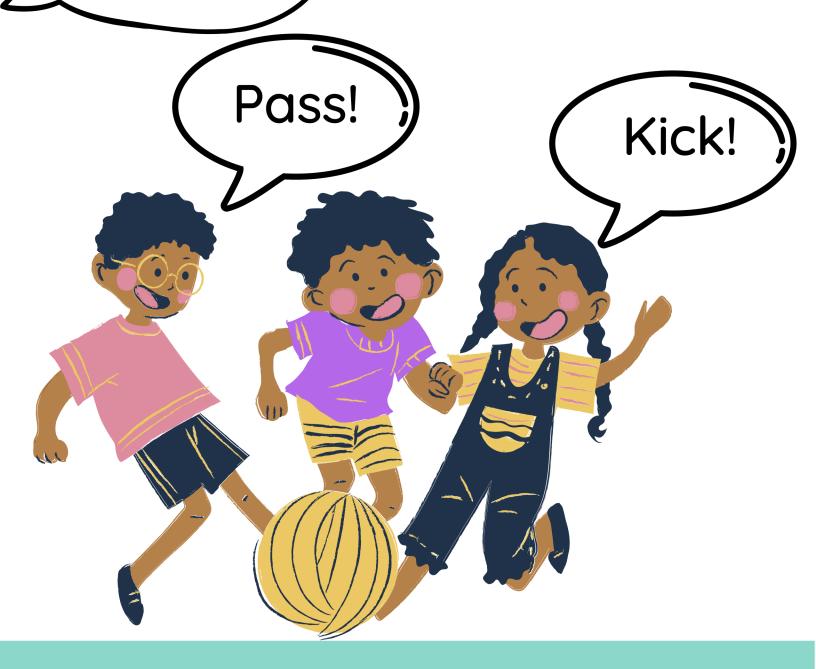
Add more semantic information to <u>extend</u> utterance.

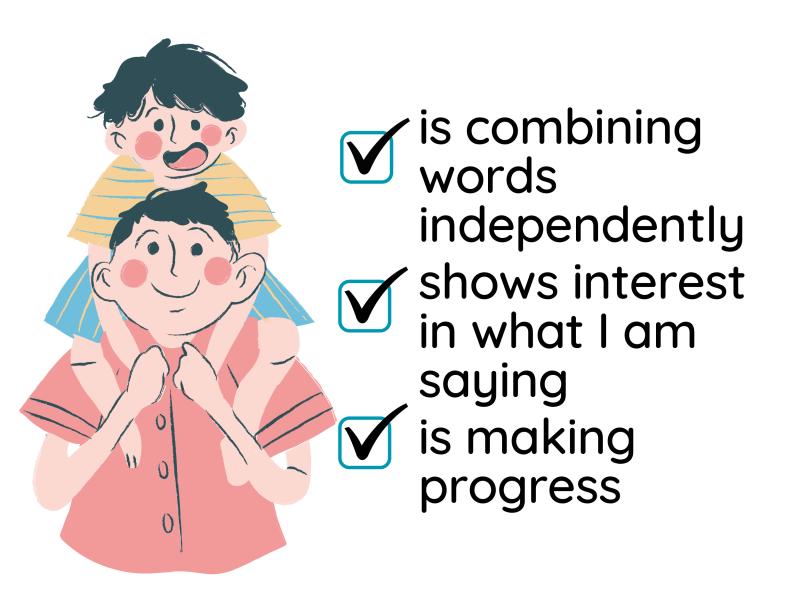
