- **Receptive language**
refers to the ability to understand and comprehend language.
- **Expressive language**
refers to the ability to use spoken language to communicate thoughts and ideas.

RECEPTIVE LANGUAGE STRATEGIES

Self Talk

Adult narrates what they are doing.

Parallel Talk

Adult narrates what the child is doing.

Modeling

Adult provides the desired targets.

EXPRESSIVE LANGUAGE STRATEGIES

Expansion

Expand on what the child says by making it longer and slightly more complex.

Extension

Add more semantic information to extend utterance.

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Add Complexity

Add complexity (grammar or vocabulary) to language and then break it down to check for understanding.

Recast Sentences

Expand on what the child says by turning it into a different type of sentence.
