Bandaid Activity

Materials: Box of bandaids (different sizes and colors), doll or stuffed animal, doctor kit, <u>Howie's Owie Worksheet</u>

Goal: Identify body parts and label body parts for children using a real-life example

Targets: Labeling Body Parts, Critical Elements, Spatial Concepts (top, bottom, under, next to, between), Prepositions (on, off, before, after, then, first, last)

Directions

- 1. Grab 5 to 6 bandaids from the box. If possible, have bandaids of different sizes and colors.
- 2. Pretend to be a doctor who needs to find the boo-boos on their patient.
- 3. Have the child identify the body part by pointing to it ("Show me the arm"). To increase generalization, have the child identify the body part on themself or an adult.
- Put a bandaid on the body part once they correctly identify it.
- 5. Have the child label or tell you what body part you are pointing to ("What is this?").
- 6. For older children, use spatial and preposition concepts when having the child put the bandaids on the stuffed animal ("Before you put a bandaid on a belly, put a bandaid on the monkey's hand" or "But the bandaid between the eyes").



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
